# Lord's Supper Meditation: A Tree

In creation, God made the earth to bring forth trees bearing fruit. Our planet, in contrast to any other planet, has millions of acres of forest. From the forest of the four-foot tall Shinoak in Ward and Winkler counties in West Texas to the towering trees of the Redwood forests on the coast of central California, from the rain forest of the Amazon basin to the vast taiga of Siberia, trees make all the difference in our environment. They feed us and shade us; trees provide building materials and renew the very atmosphere that we breathe. When God looked at all those freshly-formed forests, He said, "Good!" And it continues to be so.

What an incongruity it is, that this creator God put Himself on a tree, suffering the fate of a condemned criminal. "Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us – for it is written, 'Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree' – so that in Christ Jesus…we might receive the promised Spirit through faith" (Galatians 3:13-14).

Each Sunday morning as we gather around the Lord's table, we stand in the shade of that tree and remember all that God has done for us.

# Wisdom Calls!

In Proverbs 1:20-33, wisdom is pictured as a woman who sometimes gives advice, sometimes rebuke. When she speaks, some listen and live in safety and at ease. Others reject her words, go their own way, and end in ruin. The greatest wisdom, of course, comes from God in His Holy Word. Other wisdom comes from parents, elders, ministers, teachers, and others who have traveled the road ahead of us.

Proverbs asks us to learn from both advice and rebuke so we may do better. Those who will not learn from God, from others, and from their own mistakes, are doomed to eat the fruit of their unwise deeds.

Most people know how to do better but are unwilling to change. They refuse to set aside their pride, admit a mistake, and accept the advice of others. Listening to wisdom will help you be a better athlete, a better student, a better parent, a better child, a better employee, and above all, a better follower of Christ. So many who end in ruin had good advice but refused to take it.

Proverbs calls on us to be humble enough to listen to wisdom and heed her. That will save us from much trouble and help us please God.

Prayer for Today: Dear God, give us a humble heart to listen to You and to others who can help us. Then let us be willing to admit our need to improve and determine to follow the wisdom you give. In the name of Jesus. Amen.
